Big Idea: Wealth is worth it if we share it generously with the needy around us, our children, and for God's purposes in His Church and Kingdom.

Text: Luke 16:19-31

"There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and lived in luxury every day."

II. WE CAN GIVE TO	
A good man leaves an inheritance for his children's children, but a sinner's wealth is stored up for the righteous. – Proverbs 13:22

III. WE CAN GIVE TO	
"A tithe of everything from the land, whether grain from the soil or fruit from the trees, belongs to the LORD; it is holy to the LORD." – Leviticus 27:30	
"Will a man rob God? Yet you rob me. But you ask, 'How do we rob you?' In tithes and offerings." – Malachi 3:8	
"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the LORD Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you will not have room enough for it." – Malachi 3:10
