Text: Philippians 1:9-21

Big Idea: Turning actual biblical phrases into personal prayers can take your prayers to a whole new level of meaningfulness.

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened. -Matthew 7:7-8

Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete. -John 16:24

This is the confidence we have in approaching God: that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us. 15 And if we know that he hears us—whatever we ask—we know that we have what we asked of him. -1 John 5:14-15
