Luke 24:25-27 (NLT), “You foolish people! You find it so hard to believe all that the prophets wrote in the Scriptures. Wasn’t it clearly predicted that the Messiah would have to suffer all these things before entering his glory?” Then Jesus took them through the writings of Moses and all the prophets, explaining from all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.”

Romans 5:16-18 (ESV), “And the free gift is not like the result of that one man’s sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men.”

1 Corinthians 15:45 (NLT), “The Scriptures tell us, “The first man, Adam, became a living person.” But the last Adam—that is, Christ—is a life-giving Spirit.”

I. **Jesus has removed our guilt**

Romans 5:16-18 (ESV), “And the free gift is not like the result of that one man’s sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men.”

Romans 5:1 (NET), “Therefore, since we have been declared righteous by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.”

Isaiah 43:25 (ESV), ““I, I am he who blots out your transgressions for my own sake, and I will not remember your sins.”

Colossians 2:13-14 (ESV), “And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross.”

Hebrews 10:22 (NET), “let us draw near with a sincere heart in the assurance that faith brings, because we have had our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed in pure water.”

1 John 3:20 (ESV), “for whenever our heart condemns us, God is greater than our heart, and he knows everything.”

1 John 5:13 (ESV), “I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life.”

II. Jesus has paid the penalty for our sin

Romans 5:19 (ESV), “For as by the one man’s disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man’s obedience the many will be made righteous.”

Isaiah 53:5 (NET), “He was wounded because of our rebellious deeds, crushed because of our sins; he endured punishment that made us well; because of his wounds we have been healed.”

Galatians 3:13 (ESV), “Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree”

2 Corinthians 5:21 (ESV), “For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.”

Romans 3:24 (NLT), “Yet God, in his grace, freely makes us right in his sight. He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us from the penalty for our sins.”

III. Jesus has given us eternal life

Romans 5:17,18, 21 (ESV), “For if, because of one man’s trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ. Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men...so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.”

John 5:21 (ESV), “For as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom he will.”

John 10:28 (ESV), “I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand.”

1 Corinthians 15:45 (NLT), “The Scriptures tell us, “The first man, Adam, became a living person.” But the last Adam—that is, Christ—is a life-giving Spirit.”

Ezekiel 36:25–26 (ESV), “I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. 26 And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh.

John 3:6 (ESV), “That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

2 Corinthians 5:17 (ESV), “Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.”

Romans 5:18 (ESV), “Therefore, as one trespass led to condemnation for all men, so one act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all men.

Mark 1:5 (ESV), “And all the country of Judea and all Jerusalem were going out to him and were being baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

Romans 16:19 (ESV), “For your obedience is known to all, so that I rejoice over you, but I want you to be wise as to what is good and innocent as to what is evil.

Luke 21:37–38 (ESV), “And every day he was teaching in the temple, but at night he went out and lodged on the mount called Olivet. And early in the morning all the people came to him in the temple to hear him.
