I. Biting off more than you can chew

1 Corinthians 3:1–2 (ESV), "But I, brothers, could not address you as spiritual people, but as people of the flesh, as infants in Christ. I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it. And even now you are not yet ready..."

James 3:17a (ESV), "But the wisdom from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, open to reason..."

Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it begin to mock him, saying, 'This man began to build and was not able to finish.'"
